College in the High School Application Process, Eligibility, and Payment

The College in the High School (CIHS) program at Columbia-Greene provides area students the opportunity to take college credit-bearing courses while in high school. CIHS offers students progressive course options and access to college credit that may allow for advanced standing as they continue their educational endeavors.

CIHS courses are offered at one-third the cost of regular tuition, making them an affordable way to earn college credit. Students who qualify for the USDA National School Lunch Program may qualify to take courses at no cost.

To be eligible for CIHS coursework, students must be in pursuit of a Regents diploma and have an average of 80% or higher in the academic area they wish to study. Students must meet all course pre- and co-requisite requirements including minimum prerequisite course grades and GPA requirements as outlined in the College Catalog.

To apply, complete the CIHS application provided to your school district and return it to your Guidance Office. They will forward your application and transcript to Columbia-Greene for review.

Upon approval, you will be registered for your requested courses and mailed a letter of acceptance followed by a tuition bill, and affidavit for a Certificate of Residence. If an application or class request is denied, an official notice will be sent to the student and the Guidance Office.
